<u>Pastor's Ponderings</u> Preserve, Part with, Prune, & Pioneer

I counted our sticky notes—60* total! The reason for the asterisk by the 60 is because while 45 of them were for the things we are already doing (or could, perhaps, do more of), 15 of them are "new" ideas for how we might connect with others in the congregation or beyond our faith community. And there are some great ideas—and I'm sure we will brainstorm more in the future but, for now, we are not ready to "pioneer." We are at the stage of evaluating our current ministries, both inward and outward looking, and deciding what we are being called to do with what we currently do! That's where "preserve," "part with," and "prune" enter the conversation:

[Jesus said] I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. [...] Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear from by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. (John 15:1,4)

Branches bearing ample fruit ought to be preserved as they are. Unfortunately, when branches are withering and dead and no longer bear fruit, we must part with them for

the health of the vine. And then there are the branches that bear fruit but have more to give—these must be <u>pruned</u>.

Thanks to you and your participation in the sticky note project, we have a healthy list of ways that we connect with one another within our faith community and to those beyond this faith community. Now we have to get our hands dirty; we must engage in the difficult work of gardening. Yes, I know that in Jesus' metaphor the Father is the vinegrower. But I don't think that gives us permission to sit back and wait to be either preserved, parted with, or pruned, because if we do this, we will most certainly be parted with. (Trust me, you don't want to be the "parted with" branch. See John 15:6. Something about being thrown into the fire and burned.) God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—is active in the here and now, in this world, and in this faith community. And our call is to be active with the vinegrower, the Father, by abiding in the vine, the Son, and watching and listening and seeking the movement of the Holy Spirit—and then acting.

So, I ask you to think back. What did you write on your little sticky note, and which "P" do you think it falls under? Is it something that bears abundant fruit and ought to be preserved as-is, no changes needed? Has its time as a ministry within this faith community come and gone? Does it no longer bear fruit, and should it be parted with? Or is it something that we do but we don't do well or ought to do more of or in a different way? In other words, should it be pruned? Please, put some serious thought into these questions. And thank you for providing your input thus far. When we engage in this work together,

when we allow the Father to work on us and when we abide in the Son, the Holy Spirit is present, moving in and through this faith community. This is and must continue to be, therefore, the work of the entire community. So I repeat from previous ponderings:


